







# Family-centred Early Childhood Intervention: How to make it work

International Conference 2023

June 8<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup>

Hosted in **Tirana**, **Albania on 8th - 9th June**, the conference will focus on how to build policies and practices in the field of support for children with disabilities, or with developmental delays, and their families. The conference will address the key elements of **family-centred Early Childhood Intervention (ECI)** and the creation of **national ECI** systems. It will also share the experiences from the EASPD and UNICEF joint action on provision of emergency support for early childhood development to **families with young children with developmental difficulties displaced from Ukraine to five countries in Europe**.

In July 2022, as a response to the Ukraine war, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and EASPD launched a project to increase the availability of trained Family Consultants who will provide Early Childhood Development parental counselling and support to children at risk of or with developmental delays and disabilities. The project will also support system strengthening for the provision of ECI services in host countries as well as raise awareness of the importance of early support for developing the potential for every child.

The conference objectives will include:

- Raise public awareness around family-centred ECI benefits and functioning
- Highlight good practices and methodologies in the field of ECI
- Share the experience of service provision to Ukraine refugees in neighbouring countries
- Zoom in on the Western Balkans and EU member states, highlighting specific challenges and opportunities for the region
- Discuss the enabling factors for strengthening national ECI systems and the role of the EU in facilitating it
- Encourage greater commitment of policy makers in prioritizing ECI and ECEC policies across Europe.
