Today, we - the RESPONSE project partners - are proud to announce that we've achieved a crucial milestone in the fight against gender-based violence (GBV) against women with disabilities: the official publication of our Training and Awareness Raising (TAR) Manual. Funded by the Erasmus+ programme, the RESPONSE project has brought together stakeholders from across Europe to tackle this pressing issue of GBV head-on.

The TAR Manual aims to build the capacity of, and foster cooperation between, the different sectors involved in addressing gender-based violence against women with disabilities. Its primary objective is to disseminate knowledge between the disability sector and the victims' rights sector and vice-versa, creating a collaborative space for learning and action.

Available in English, French, Hungarian, Lithuanian, Polish, Portuguese, and Spanish, key highlights from the TAR manual include:

• In-depth analysis of the challenges faced by women with disabilities, including intersectional discrimination and barriers to accessing judicial and support services.
