TIDE – Towards inclusive development education



About

The project's purpose is to develop among a group of European citizens with an intellectual or multiple disabilities an awareness and understanding of the interdependent world and of their role, responsibility and lifestyles in relation to a globalised society.

We intend to support their active engagement in the key issues of justice, human rights, and sustainable ways of living. We shall encourage further actions having a similar scope in Europe with guidance and examples of good practice.

This project wants to show that having a disability is not an obstacle to become promoters of justice, human rights and sustainable.



Activities

The action will develop experimental development education and active citizenship activities in 4 countries in Europe:

Belgium, Italy, Hungary, Finland and Wales.



In each country a joint team of development education professionals and educators/tutors or activity leaders from the field of disability, will work with groups of young people with a disability through learning workshops, raising the awareness of participants about global development issues.

Youth event in the European Economic and Social Committee

The event will involve a core group of participants from the different countries involved in the project. Participants will have a unique transnational opportunity to promote a manifesto about their views on fairness, equality and human rights.

Final Conference in Salzburg

An international conference in Salzburg for service providers and development education workers will be organized in Autumn 2015
